

Sewing Mat/Organizer

Mat Body

You may wish to cut these pieces 2 inches bigger and trim them to size after you have quilted them.

Two 20" x 23" panels for front and back of mat

One 20" x 23" piece scrap batting

Pocket Panels

Fusible fleece or scrap batting 20" x 5.25"

Pocket lining fabric 20" x 5.25"

A: 5.25" x 5.25" (this will be partially covered by pocket piece F)

B: 3" x 5.25" (this will be partially covered by pocket piece F)

C: 5" x 5.25" center block. Recommend fussy cutting

D: 3.5" x 5.25" (this will be partially covered by pocket piece G)

E: 5.25" x 5.25" recommend fussy cutting

F: 3.25" x 7.5" recommend fussy cutting

G: 3" x 3.25" recommend fussy cutting

Three pieces of trim 5.5" long by at least 3/8" wide. They can be up to 1" wide

Binding

These can be the same fabric or two different ones.

3 pieces 2.25" by width of fabric (to go around edges of mat)

1 piece 1.75" by 21" (for top of pocket panel)

Other:

Coordinating or matching thread. You will be quilting the mat part and top stitching the binding.

This can be scrappy or very planned. It's a great opportunity to use part of a fat quarter collection. You can cut your pieces in class, it's not necessary to do it ahead of time. The dimensions were provided so you have an idea of the scale of the pocket pieces.

Bring your precious Renaissance ribbon scraps or other special trims.

If you have an orphan block that can be trimmed to 5" x 5.25", you can use it for the center block and plan the rest of your mat around it.
